In 1985-1987, he had Research Fellowship in Department of Medicine, College of Physicians & Surgeons of Columbia University, New York, NY, USA. At Gifu University School of Medicine, he became Assistant Professor in 1984, Associate Professor in 1989, and Professor in 1997. He was also appointed to Chairman, Gifu University Hospital in 2006-2010.

Dr. Tetsuo Asano



Dr. Asano is President of Japan Advanced Institute of Science and Technology (JAIST), where he has been since 2014. He received his Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Engineering in 1972 and 1974, respectively, and Ph.D. degree in 1977 from Osaka University. His research interests include algorithms, especially

computational geometry and memory-constrained algorithms. In 1977 he joined Osaka Electro-

Communication University as a lecturer and then moved to JAIST as a professor in 1997. In JAIST he served an Assistant to the president and Director of Center for Graduate Education Initiative before becoming Dean of School of Information Science. He served as editors of many international journals such as Discrete and Computational Geometry, Int. J. on Computational Geometry and Applications, and Computational Geometry: Theory and Application. He is a Fellow of the ACM.

Tohoku University

University Short Description

Tohoku University is a research-oriented university located in Sendai. Established in 1907, it was the first Japanese university to accept female students. Tohoku University is one of Japan's leading universities, with 10 faculties, 15 graduate schools, 3 professional graduate schools, 6 research institutes, a hospital and affiliated research and education centers. It has academic exchange agreements at university level with 227 institutions, and at department level with 497 institutions in 60 countries and regions. It maintains 18 offices in 11 countries and regions. The number of students is approximately 18,600 including 2,100 international students.

Tohoku University aims to become a university that is respected around the world for excellence in both education and research. In education, we founded the Institute for Excellence in Higher Education in April 2014, as we address the necessity of creating a GPA and course numbering system. Further, we are continuing to promote the "Tohoku University Global Leader Program (TGL)" and are improving the study environment for increasing student mobility. In research, we aim to enhance the quality of support for our young researchers. Further, through our international visitor research institute "Tohoku Forum for Creativity," we allow our young researchers to engage in exchanges with researchers from overseas. These efforts, which were highly evaluated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), led TU to be named a Designated National University, one of the first three universities to be selected under this new system by the Japanese Government in June 2017.

Tohoku University has 6 university-level agreements and 14 department-level agreements with institutions in Spain. In addition, Tohoku University is a member of T.I.M.E. (Top Industrial Managers for Europe), which is an international network of leading higher educational institutions that specialize in engineering.

Tokyo University of Forign Studies

University Short Description

As one of the oldest institutions of higher education in Japan, the ancestor of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (TUFS), Tokyo Gaikokugo Gakko (Tokyo School of Foreign Languages), was founded in 1873. After World War II, in 1949, TUFS was established as a university organized under a new postwar educational system. Initially, when it was formed as a new-system university, it had only one undergraduate program with twelve departments. Afterward, the University gradually increased the number of its departments and other organizational units. In 2012, the undergraduate program was reorganized resulting in the establishment of two schools: the School of Language and Culture Studies and the School of International and Area Studies. Today, in addition to these schools, TUFS has a Graduate School of Area and Culture Studies, which offers a master's program and a doctoral program, and two affiliated organizations: the Research Institute for Languages and Cultures of Asia and Africa, and the Japanese Language Center for International Students. The mission of TUFS where a total of 78 languages are currently taught, is to foster multilingual and globally-minded students who will play a leading role in the globalized world in the twenty-first century. At TUFS, internationality, interdisciplinarity, and interculturality are the foundations of research and education. The research and education opportunities offered at TUFS are not only focusing on language acquisition, but on foreign studies that involve in-depth studies about various regions of the world, including their culture and history.

Based on its history of more than 100 years, TUFS continues to play an important role as one of the hubs of international academic research and exchange in Japan in the 21st century. TUFS as a frontier of Japan's globalization nurtures students with the necessary knowledge and skills to engage in international activities, and the perspective of viewing the world through Japan, and reexamining Japan from international perspectives.

Ochanomizu University

University Short Description

Ochanomizu University, established in 1875 as Japan's first higher education institution for women, celebrated the 140th anniversary of its founding in 2015. Over this period, the University has been a pioneer at the forefront of education for all women who are motivated to learn and wish to contribute to society.

Kanazawa University

University Short Description

Kanazawa University originated in 1862 as a smallpox vaccination center, and became a university in 1949. It aims to be "a research university dedicated to education, while opening up its doors to both local and global society," and strives to contribute to 1) opening up a new 21st century era, and 2) promoting world peace and the continuous development of mankind. The university offers highly versatile undergraduate program through 17 Schools. Also, there are 7 graduate schools and 1 united graduate school. The university also takes pride in the most advanced research as one of the leaders in the globalization of Japanese universities. In 2014, MEXT selected Kanazawa University for the 'Top Global University Project.' In 2016, we opted to be among the "Excellent Global Universities" category financed by the Japanese government. In 2017, we were selected for the "World Premier International Research Center Initiative (WPI)" by MEXT.

As of August 2018, Kanazawa University has over 180 institutional-level and 70 departmental-level partners. It actively exchanges students and researchers with partner universities, including double-degree and twinning programs and graduate programs especially modeled for government-sponsored students from Indonesia and Vietnam. The university strongly promotes student exchanges with partners in Russia, China, Thailand, etc. Research collaborations include the environmental measurement in the Angkor ruins, cultural resource studies of the Mayan civilization, research on chronic health conditions caused by dioxin exposure in Vietnam, and more.

Japan Advanced Institute of Science and Technology

University Short Description

JAIST was founded in October 1990 as the first independent national graduate university, to carry out graduate education based on research at the highest level in advanced science and technology. JAIST aims at establishing an ideal model of graduate education for Japan. Admission Criteria for People with Diverse Backgrounds

In our admission decisions we place the most significant weight on the motivation of the student as demonstrated in the personal interview. JAIST admits highly motivated students, including advanced undergraduate students (who have completed at least three years of undergraduate study), professionals, and international students, regardless of undergraduate specialization.

Systematic Graduate Education

JAIST educates students through a carefully and systematically designed courseworkoriented curriculum, which gives students a solid foundation for their advanced research. This is different from the traditional Japanese style of graduate education, where students are trained mainly in their narrow research domains.

Development of Human Resources for Society

We train our students in a specialized field combined with interdisciplinary knowledge of related disciplines. Through our educational program students gain thorough understanding of fundamentals, and develop problem-solving skills.

Outstanding Faculty

Our faculty members are world-class researchers. We recruit professionals with outstanding achievements at the leading edge of science and technology. They come from all over the world, from other universities, and from top industrial research and development institutions. Collaboration with Society and Industry

JAIST works closely with the regional community, as well as industries worldwide, by promoting collaborative research and accepting commissioned research. We use various modes of cooperation including visiting faculty chairs, endowed chairs, and laboratories operated jointly with other institutions.

Gifu University

University Short Description

Outline

Gifu University is a mid-sized university with five faculties, four master's programs, one professional degree program, two doctoral programs and three united graduate schools. With the relocation of the school of medicine and university hospital in 2004, all faculties and schools are now located on a single campus. In addition, buildings and research facilities for third through sixth year students of Gifu Pharmaceutical University moved onto the same campus.

Excellent Practice

Recently, we have had major success in becoming a national model through various activities ranging from local community work, to international efforts. These have included becoming a Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology's Center for Community (COC), creating advanced type COC+ projects, both of which have attained the highest evaluation of "S" for Gifu University, forming an agricultural science consortium consisting of 16 universities in South Asia (IC-GU12: International Consortium of Universities in South and Southeast Asia for the Doctoral Education in Agricultural Science and Biotechnology), and creating an international engineering network of 44 universities. The university also offers various courses including a "Program to Develop Human Resources with Expertise in Dies," a "Maintenance Expert Fostering Program" for maintenance and operation of infrastructure, a "Professional Degree Program" for highlyprofessional personnel in school administration, an Emergency Medical Network Development Program, and an International Studies in Liberal Arts. We consider that our duty is to further raise Gifu University's presence not only in Central Japan areas, but also throughout Japan and overseas and to win even greater praise from students, their guardians, local residents and taxpayers through these efforts.

Internationalization

The global expansion of the university is of particular importance. We will continue to increase exchanges between universities to make it possible to accept more than the 400 international students who study at the university now. Additionally, our goals are to ascertain the various needs (problems faced) in regions where Gifu University students study, to conduct research and study and develop solutions to these problems, and in this way to truly make contributions overseas. To this end, we will start the four Joint Degree Programs for Master's and Doctoral Degree with overseas universities in 2019. As this new initiative is manifesting itself, we firmly believe that it is important to undertake internationalization rooted in local communities and provide "glocal" services that provide local communities in Japan and overseas with the benefits from those efforts. We use the same approach for other activities that contribute to local communities in Japan and consider this the essence of our COC and COC+ projects.

University Short Description

The mission of Toyohashi University of Technology (TUT) is to conduct research and education in technological science, developing new technologies through scientific inquiry. Based on this mission, TUT targets new graduates from technical colleges and high schools for enrollment, and with its graduate school emphasis, TUT conducts research in technological science, fostering practical, creative, and leading engineers and researchers as it forges a path toward a new era.

A major feature of TUT's education is its "spiral-up curriculum". In this curriculum, students who received specific technical instruction (basic and specialized) in their first and second years of undergraduate education and technical college will repeat the subjects from their third year with more advanced approaches in order to accumulate further competence in their basic and specialized education, creating a spiral-like education.

In their fourth undergraduate year (before advancing to graduate school), students will undertake long-term internships in the business sector, and through their experiences in dealing with problems as a working engineer, they will come to understand the meaning of their education, and how the master's program is meant to create practical, creative, and innovative engineers.

In this way, TUT is able to nurture students who understand science and have a deep interest in technology due to their repetition of basic and specialized education and their practical training in the work place.

As a globally focused university, TUT sends Japanese students abroad, accepts international students, and promotes joint international research and personnel exchanges through collaborations with its overseas education base established in Penang State, Malaysia and other affiliated exchange schools. These activities are mainly centered on the area of Southeast Asia.

Kanda University of International Studies

University Short Description

Kanda University of International Studies (KUIS), founded in 1987, is a private university dedicated to the pursuit of excellence in international studies, particularly in the areas of foreign languages, intercultural communication, Japanese culture, linguistics, and international studies. In 2003 it was awarded the "Good Practice Award" for innovation in education by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. There are four departments on campus: English, Asian Languages (Chinese, Korean, Indonesian, Vietnamese, and Thai), Spanish and Portuguese, and International Communication. The university also has a Graduate School Program and a Japanese Language and Culture Program for international students. About 4,100 enrolled students and about 150 international students are in the various courses.

Since the founding of the university, KUIS has produced a large number of Japanese teachers by offering an undergraduate program as well as postgraduate degree program in Japanese Language Pedagogy. With this background the Japanese Language and Culture Program was established in September 2000.

Keio University

University Short Description

Founded in 1858, Keio University is Japan's oldest private comprehensive research university. Keio has 6 major campuses across the greater Tokyo area with 14 graduate schools, 10 undergraduate faculties, and a university hospital. In 2014, Keio was selected as one of the 13 Top Type (Type A) universities for the Japanese government's Top Global University Project, receiving funding to enhance the international competitiveness of Japanese universities.

The student population at Keio University is about 33,000, and our international community is growing year-by-year. In 2017, Keio had a total of 1,677 international students from over 70 countries, which included those who enrolled in the Student Exchange Program and the Japanese Language Program, as well as short-term and research programs. Keio offers more than 800 courses conducted in English, 29 double degree programs, and 24 degree programs. Furthermore, in 2016, over 1,400 of our Japanese students studied abroad.

Keio has over 300 international partners with which it actively engages in both educational and research collaborations. The university is a member of many international university associations, such as the Global University Leaders Forum at the World Economic Forum and the Association of Pacific Rim Universities.

Funding for the university totaled approximately 20.2 billion yen in FY2016, and in FY2017, it received 3.2 billion yen (11th-most in Japan) in Grants-in-Aid for Scientific Research, the largest competitive research fund provided by the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science.

Keio has a strong alumni network, and there are many prominent Keio alumni in all corners of society, particularly in the business sector. Keio has the greatest number of graduates who have become CEOs of companies listed in the first section of the Tokyo Stock Exchange, and was ranked 9th in the world in the Times Higher Education Alma Mater Index: Global Executives 2013 (the last year the ranking was compiled). The university has also produced 3 prime ministers and 2 astronauts.

Seisen University

University Short Description

Seisen University is a small women's Catholic liberal arts university located in the heart of Tokyo, and it has strong connection with Spain and Spanish-speaking countries from the beginning. Seisen means "fountain of purity (fuente de pureza)" in Japanese, and was originally founded in 1935 to educate young women in Japan by the religious congregation of Handmaids of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (Esclavas del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús). The congregation had been started by a Spanish sister Santa Rafaela María Porras who is originally from Pedro Abad, a village near Córdoba. When Seisen officially started as a university after the second world war, in 1950, the first president was an Argentinian sister, Madre Ernestina Ramallo.

Seisen has established a solid position in providing higher education for women in Japan. It now has five departments at undergraduate level: Department of Spanish Language and Literature; Department of Japanese Language and Literature; Department of English Language and Literature; Department of Cultural History, and Department of Global Citizenship Studies. Although undergraduate degree programs are for women only, Seisen's graduate school is co-ed. There are three programs at Master's level (Language and Culture, Thought and Culture, and Global Citizenship Studies), and one program at Doctor's level (Doctor's program in Humanities).

Because of its relatively small size (less than 2000 students), Seisen University offers students a personal and at-home ambiance. Seisen has 36 international partner institutions in 13 countries (as of August 2018), out of which 9 are Spanish institutions. We welcome about 10 exchange students for a semester or two every year mainly from our Asian partners. These exchange students find it easy to make friends and get accustomed to the life at Seisen because of our intimate and at-home atmosphere. Seisen also welcomes international students from our partner universities for tailor-made short term Japanese language and culture programs for one to two weeks.

Seisen recently refurbished one floor of the convent and turned it into a student dormitory of 13 rooms (women only). The dormitory is within 5 minutes' walk from the university and is expected to offer a very reasonable rent in the center of Tokyo. The dormitory will start accepting students from March 2019, and we hope the dormitory will help us welcome more international students to Seisen.

Sophia University

University Short Description

Sophia University was founded by the Jesuits in 1913, with the mission to build bridges between Japan and the world. Sophia has been a pioneer of international education in Japan, attracting faculty and students from all over the world and has grown to be one of the foremost of Japan's private universities with a student body of 14,000 undergraduate and graduate students and more than 1,500 teaching staff members. Sophia is located in the heart of Tokyo, where the dynamism of the global city Tokyo can be strongly felt.

Sophia University has 9 undergraduate faculties with 29 departments, and 10 graduate schools with 25 programs. At undergraduate level, all classes in the Faculty of Liberal Arts as well as the Green Science Program and Green Engineering Program in the Faculty of Science and Technology are taught in English. English-medium programs are also offered at graduate level, in Global Studies, Green Science and Technology, Global Environmental Studies and Linguistics (TESOL). Faculty members contribute to research in the humanities, social sciences, natural sciences and engineering. Additionally, the Sophia Research Organization, which supports university sponsored and funded research centers, has ten permanent research institutes.

Sophia's international spirit has flourished in its student and faculty exchange programs, which began more than 80 years ago. Research scholars and faculty members from all over the world also visit every year, working on collaborative research with faculty and offering classes and special seminars to undergraduate and graduate students.

Tokai University

University Short Description

Tokai University is a private university established by Dr. Shigeyoshi Matsumae in1942. "Tokai" of "Tokai University" refers to the sea to the east of Asia, namely the Pacific Ocean, and symbolizes the desire to foster rich spirits and broad perspectives. Tokai University consists of 7 campuses in Sapporo, Takanawa, Yoyogi, Shonan, Isehara, Shimizu, Kumamoto, which are composed of 19 schools and colleges made up of 75 departments, majors, and programs. Its graduate schools offer 31 programs. The total student population is about 30,000.

Tokai University maintains academic exchange agreements with more than 120 universities/organizations in 39 countries. A wide range of international exchange activities are being aggressively pursued, from those on the academic front involving students, researchers, joint-research projects, and the exchange of academic resources, to cultural and athletic exchange. There are 961 international students on campus. Tokai University has five offices abroad (Denmark, Vienna, Hawaii, Korea and Thailand.)

Providing educational and research activities in support of a society where human beings can live together in harmony with nature Tokai University also carries out interdisciplinary research activities by closely cooperating with its other 3 junior colleges, 10 research institutes and 5 research centers.

The aim of this cooperation is to challenge individuals to deal with various issues facing mankind, such as resources, energy, information technology, medical care, welfare, peace and security. As a part of these research activities, Tokai University holds many international seminars and symposiums in collaboration with foreign universities and research institutes. Tokai University supports international exchange and cooperation through the promotion of cultural, academic and sports exchanges.

Tokai University also has aimed to be a university open to the local community and has endeavored to promote friendly relationships with the community.

For example, our educational institutions located in Shonan, Yoyogi, Shimizu and Isehara participate positively in local activities such as city planning, social education and lifelong education in an effort to provide the local community with the results of our educational and research activities.

In this way, Tokai University aims at being "dynamic university" characterized by its diversified and comprehensive educational system while giving full play to all of its educational and research activities as a university.

Rikkyo University

University Short Description

Founded in 1874 by Episcopalian Missionary Bishop Channing M. Williams, Rikkyo University has been recognized as one of the oldest and most prestigious private universities in Japan. The main campus is conveniently located in the Tokyo metropolitan area of Ikebukuro, and the second campus is located in a suburban area north of Tokyo called Niiza. With its motto, "Academy of Freedom," Rikkyo has always been an institution where liberal arts education empowers all students to explore their world, learn to fulfill their potential and acquire leadership skills.

The University currently has an enrollment of nearly 20,000 students including over 900 international students from more than 50 countries. Rikkyo has a truly global outlook, and has set out a number of ambitious targets for internationalization under the University's strategy, "Rikkyo Global 24". Additionally, Rikkyo has been selected as one of the most globalized universities in Japan by the Japanese government's 'Top Global University Project'. The project, which has been initiated and subsidized by the Ministry of Education, Cultures, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) since 2014, aims to further enhance global education among Japanese universities, and the University plays an active role to lead global education in Japan.

The University operates 10 Colleges for undergraduate programs (Arts, Business, Economics, Intercultural Communication, Law and Politics, Science, Sociology, Tourism, Community and Human Services, and Contemporary Psychology) and 14 Graduate Schools leading up to the doctoral level as well as a number of research institutes. The latest addition is the Global Liberal Arts Program (GLAP) which is a four-year undergraduate program launched in 2017. All GLAP classes at are fully taught in English, as are the classes in the College of Intercultural Communication's Dual Language Pathway as well as the Master of International Business course.

Rikkyo University currently has more than 210 academic agreements with institutions overseas. With regard to the collaboration with universities in Spain, Rikkyo partners with University of Alicante, University of Leon, University of Salamanca, University of Seville (four institutional-level partners) and University of the Basque Country (one faculty-level partner; College of Intercultural Communication).
