#### 1. University Short Description (About 300 words)

The University of Girona (Universitat de Girona, UdG, www.udg.edu) is located in the city of Girona, Catalonia, Spain. It was reconstituted as a university in 1991, although its origins go back to the General Studio, an entity created in 1446. The UdG consists of 3 campuses and several buildings across Girona: Montilivi, Barri Vell, Centre, and the Scientific and Tecnological Park. Since its founding, the university has had five presidents (rectors in the spanish system) being Joaquim Salvi the current rector since 2017. Despite being a young and relatively small university, it has been placed within the top 4% of universities in the World University Rankings 2018.

At a bachelor level, the UdG has more than 15,000 students divided in 44 BSc degrees (including 12 double degrees) and 3 international BSc degrees and all disciplines: education, law, business and economics, engineering, sciences, art, medicine, humanities and literature and tourism.

Regarding master students, UdG has 25 official master studies, 15 inter-university masters and 12 double-degree international master agreements, with a total of 1,000 students. Master studies focus in several fields: Molecular Biology and Health; Human, Cultural and Heritage sciences; Law, Economics and Business; Education and Psicology; Chemistry and Natural environment; Tourism and Technology and Engineering. Moreover, coordinates 2 Erasmus Mundus international Master studies: European Master in Tourism Management (EMTM) and the European Master in Medical Imaging and Applications (MAIA).

With respect to doctoral studies, UdG has 800 PhD students enrolled in 14 PhD programs with more than 100 PhD thesis defended every year. The PhD programs include Molecular Biology; Water Science and Technology; Human, Cultural and Heritage sciences; Education; Natural environment; Psychology and health; Chemistry; Technology and inter-university studies in Art and Education, Bioinformatics, Law, Economics and Business, Gender studies, Educational Psychology and Tourism.

In research, the UdG has 60 well-established research groups, with 175 active research projects. In terms of outputs and only in the last year, it has produced 56 books, 233 book chapters, 3 patents and 870 ISI indexed journals.

In terms of services and facilities, it has 3 libraries with more than 10,000 square meters, and half a million books (including electronic), the scientific Park (with more than 100 companies and 1,500 people), accommodation and sports, restaurants, computer rooms, and a language center.

The Miguel Hernández University has 7 faculties (Faculty of Experimental Sciences, Faculty of Fine Arts, Faculty of Health and Social Sciences, Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Pharmacy, Faculty of Social and Legal Sciences of Elche, and Faculty of Social and Legal Sciences of Orihuela) and 2 schools (School of Engineering of Elche and School of Engineering of Orihuela). Three prestigious research institutes lead investigation in the areas of biotechnology and biomedicine (Institute of Bioengineering; Institute of Research, Development and Innovation in Health Biotechnology of Elche; Institute of Neurosciences). The UMH is the top Spanish university in creating technology-based companies (IUNE Observatory), it is in 4<sup>th</sup> position in the U-Ranking of Spanish universities in terms of productivity, is 5<sup>th</sup> in the ISSUE Ranking for Teaching, Research and Innovation and Technological Development among Spanish universities, 6<sup>th</sup> in the ranking of annual scientific production per professor in Spain, and 1<sup>st</sup> in the Valencia Region (publications per faculty member).

Regarding academics, the Miguel Hernández University of Elche offers 25 bachelor's, 53 master's, and 13 doctoral programs. In addition to these official programs, the UMH also offers hundreds of its own continuing education courses and programs, including University Expert, unique UMH Master's, Advanced University Diploma, University Specialist, Summer, Winter, Refinement, Bridging, university access, and language instruction, among others.

UMH employees include 1,085 research personnel and teaching faculty, of which 552 are full-time and 521 are part-time. As for its researchers and faculty, 712 hold PhD's. There are 463 university staff employees, and 275 employees are contracted through projects.

To consolidate international presence and projection, the Miguel Hernández University of Elche maintains 593 agreements with foreign universities, 360 with Spanish universities, and 16 agreements for joint degree programs with universities outside Spain. As for mobility, the UMH helped send off 281 outgoing students to learn elsewhere during the 2017/2018

academic year while it welcomed 290 incoming students into its classrooms. These incoming figures include individuals who came to the UMH for internships, on study abroad programs, and as visiting students.

Moreover, the areas of Internationalization and Linguistic Support are involved in various areas to advance the international presence and projection of the UMH.

### 1. University Short Description (About 300 words)

The Public University of Navarre (UPNA), an International Campus of Excellence, is a young academic institution (approx. 8000 students) that heads the list of Spanish universities in terms of teaching quality and the capacity to attract new students.

With an international vocation and a strong commitment to teaching, the University, which has campuses in Pamplona and Tudela, and possesses outstanding facilities and services, provides the local region with human, technological and entrepreneurial capital, and its socio-economic impact is extremely positive.

The UPNA has received International Campus of Excellence certification from the Spanish Ministry of Education for forming part of Campus Íberus, a project in which it participates along with the universities of La Rioja, Lleida and Zaragoza.

The project is based on three areas of specialisation: materials and technology to enhance the quality of life (with two branches: technology for health, and energy and the environment); agrifood and nutrition; and memory, heritage and identities.

21 multilingual Undergraduate Degree qualifications (taught in Spanish, Basque and English, 1<sup>st</sup> University in Spain teaching courses in English) in different areas of knowledge are available at the University. 30 different Master degrees and 7 PhD programs. We offer around 20 own studies in different knowledge areas including one Master Course of Spanish Language and Culture, Marketing and Tourism where we have 2 successful editions.

UPNA performs intense research work, both basic and targeted, and is increasingly involved in transferring knowledge to the manufacturing sector and society in general. A total of 948 researchers currently work in 111 research groups covering different fields of knowledge and whose work has been externally evaluated twice in the last couple of years, the results proving highly positive. It has 6 research institutes where we collaborate in research and knowledge transfer to the industry and society.

UPNA has more than 300 university agreements in 50 different countries and more than 20% of our alumni have an experience abroad. Each year we manage 600 students around the world. We encourage our students with our own "International Program" to spend one year abroad and take more than half of their studies in English. For example, almost all our BA degree is fully taught in English.

#### Name of University: Universidad de Salamanca - University of Salamanca

#### 1. University Short Description (About 300 words)

This year, the University of Salamanca is celebrating its 800th anniversary. Since it was founded by the King Alfonso IX of León, in the year 1218, the University of Salamanca has been committed to carrying knowledge beyond the boundaries of the known world. Thus, the University of Salamanca became, along with Paris, Oxford and Bologna one of the first European universities and today is the only Spanish that has maintained its activity over the centuries.

The University of Salamanca has gone through a time of unprecedented expansion with the creation of the first American universities, which from 1551 began to be founded following the stir of the Salamanca by using their founding statues as a model. More than 70% of the universities created in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries now consider the University of Salamanca their 'Alma Mater'. Currently, the prestige of Salamanca attracts to itself a confluence of students from all the peninsular area, and even European and American.

At present, the University of Salamanca counts with nine campuses distributed between Salamanca, Ávila, Zamora, Béjar and Villamayor among which are distributed 26 faculties and colleges and the 12 research centers that cover aspects as varied as the biosciences or the laser, passing through agri-food developments, neurosciences, history studies or basic research, among others.

The campuses are joined by centers dedicated to strengthening academic and cultural ties with other countries and cultures such as the Spanish-Japanese Cultural Center, the Center for Spanish-Brazilian Studies or the Institute of Iberian-American Studies, where the continuous movement of teachers and students maintains ties and creates new perspectives of future in the established alliances.

Created in 1999, the Spanish-Japanese Cultural Center aims to promote knowledge and cooperation between Japan and Spain, from academic and cultural exchanges to economic relations. For this, it works in collaboration with the Association of the University of Salamanca in Japan, with companies, teaching and research institutions and Japanese and Spanish non-governmental organizations, as well as with the public administrations of both countries. Among its activities are the teaching of the Japanese language, the Cultural Week of Japan, the offer of courses for professionals and companies, the organization of artistic and cultural cycles, support for higher education and the promotion of research on Japan.

Another of the distinctive features of the University is the teaching of Spanish that attracts thousands of foreign students in the different educational programs developed in one of the largest training centers for foreigners of world renown, the Spanish International Courses entity of the University of Salamanca. Since International Courses, the Diplomas of Spanish as a Foreign Language (DELE) have been developed for years and, recently, the first digital certificate of Spanish (SIELE) that can be done from anywhere in the world and that will carry the certification of the Salamanca study as endorsement to its validity, has been

created by Cervantes Institute, National Autonomous University of Mexico and the University of Buenos Aires and University of Salamanca.

We are convinced that both events, the 800th Anniversary and gathering like this one, are key opportunities to show society that the University still plays a major role in social, cultural, personal and political-economic development.

True to this spirit of openness towards society in its various forms, we believe that the relationship between the Japanese and Spanish Universities reflects the spirit of openness and the best way of spreading that makes humans thinking beings. Therefore, we could say that this it is not merely a symbolic event, but the reflection of an advanced society that defends common values that bind us together at all levels.

### 1. University Short Description (About 300 words)

Founded in 1505, the University of Seville (US) is the second largest in Spain (over 70.000 students), and the first in Andalucía. At the centre of gravity of the city's social and cultural life, the university owns an extensive historic-artistic collection amounting to thousands of pieces. It is on a par with some of Spain's major museums. The Library repository of ancient books (largely digitized), with more than 200 incunabula, is one of the best in Spain.

The University has five main campuses within the city, with 27 Faculties and Schools. More than 7000 agreements with companies and other institutions ensure a broad range of opportunities for work placements, promoting the employability of their students.

As a comprehensive university, the U. of Seville has one of the widest academic offers at Spain. ### Name of University: ESDi Higher School of Design

### 1. University Short Description (About 300 words)

In 1989, several public administrations, business and Company groups in the design sector came together to strenghthen Catalan industry by professionalising the work of designers. ESDi was the fruit of these efforts. The aim of the University was to provide to Design students the skills, know-how and competitiveness they needed to make their mark on the world.

The foundation of the school, the launch of its degrees and its association with the Ramon Llull University (URL) were not the only steps taken. ESDi also forged an Alliance with the Fashion Arts and Techniques School (EATM), a leader in the field of Design Education in Barcelona.

ESDi has over 14.000m2 of facilities distributed along its Sabadell campus and its extension classrooms in Barcelona (Passeig de Gràcia). The facilities include computing classrooms, industrial, manufacturing, seripgraphy and knitwear workshops, video studio, professional editing rooms for audio and video, etc. In addition, the school has incorporated 3 self-labs with cutting-edge technology (additive manufacturing and 3D printing, immersive and holographic virtual reality and digitalization of textile design and manufacturing).

Since then, the School has incorporated an officially-recognised University Degree in Design and progressively built up six itineraries in Design. These itineraries are: Fashion, Product, Graphic, Interior, Audiovisual Design and Design Management. The University Degree in Design (Bachelor level) is also offered in English. ESDi added Master's Degree and Postgraduate courses and internationalised its activities.

ESDi's graduate offer in English contains MA UI/UX and MA Fashion Industry and Design Management in collaboration with MANGO. Following the internationalisation of the school, a Bachelor in Smart Design has been created; a program for the connected, tech-savvy, innovative designes of the future. Given that technology must go hand-in-glove with human qualities; the Bachelor in Digital Humanities came soon after to meet the needs of a world in which analysis, understanding, and projection are slowly breaking down the barriers between Humanities and Science.
