5月29日(日)から6月3日(金)まで NAFSA(北米地区国際交流協議会)年次総会がカナダ・バンクーバーで開催され、うち6月1日(水)には、「Japan's Response to the March 11 Earthquake and Tsunami and Fukushima Accident」と題した日本特別セッションが開催されました。

このセッションは、JAFSA(国際教育交流協議会)の働きかけにより実現したもので、 震災後の日本留学に対する政府や大学の取組をオールジャパンで紹介するもので す。当日は、文部科学省からの報告に続き、国立大学協会の野上専務理事が、被災 地域の国立大学の状況や国大協による震災後の取組、今後の国立大学の貢献など について説明を行いました。特に、国立大学が今回の震災を教訓にして、教育研究 活動を最大限の努力をしながら推進していくことなどが述べられました。

セッションは早朝だったにもかかわらず 160 人を超す聴衆がつめかけ、日本の震災からの復興に対する関心の高さを伺わせました。

国立大学協会では、今後、国立大学における外国人留学生、研究者の受入れや国際交流活動の一層の推進について、機会をとらえて発信していきたいと考えています。






